**Short Summary: ORC 3707.57 Bloodborne infectious disease prevention programs      April, 2018**

The board of health of a general health district may establish a bloodborne infectious disease prevention program in accordance with **ORC 3707.57 Bloodborne infectious disease prevention programs.**

According to ORC 3703.57, the board of health shall determine:

1. the manner in which the program is operated (specific requirements listed in the ORC)
2. the individuals who are eligible to participate (specific requirements listed in the ORC)
3. will consult with the required interested parties in advance of establishing a program

Those who much be consulted include:

- Law enforcement representatives
- Prosecutors
- Representatives of community addiction services providers
- Persons recovering from substance abuse
- Relevant private, nonprofit organizations, including hepatitis C and HIV advocacy organizations
- Residents of the health district
- The board of alcohol, drug addiction, and mental health services that serves the area in which the health district is located.
- Representatives selected by the governing authority of the city, village, or township in which the program is proposed to be established.

If, after consulting those listed, the board of health decides to establish a bloodborne infectious disease prevention program, the board shall:

1. provide written notice of the proposed location to the governing authority of the city, village, or township in which the program is to be located, and
2. will include details about the program in its annual report

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
