VISITATION

SCHEDULE

Visitation days for the Rehabilitation Center are Saturday and Wednesday. The times for Saturday visitation depend on what unit the child is housed in.

Saturday Visitation times are as follows:

Unit O 1:15 PM 1:45 PM

Unit A 3:15 PM 3:45 PM

Unit B 2:10 PM 2:40 PM

All Wednesday visitations are from 6:15 PM until 6:45 PM.

Note: Visitation begins promptly at scheduled time! At the scheduled time, the group will be transported to the visitation area. All visitors will enter at the same time and leave at the same time. If you are late, you will not be permitted in the building.

WHO CAN VISIT?

Parents, stepparents and legal guardians are the only visitors allowed for residents. Visitors' names will be checked against the approved list provided by the Intake Supervisor. In extreme cases, special visits may be discussed with the child's probation officer. These special requests will be reviewed and approved or denied by the Superintendent or Deputy Superintendent. Visitors must have some form of legal identification (driver's license, birth certificate, social security card, etc.). Boyfriends, girlfriends, infants and toddlers will not be allowed!

WHAT TO DO & WHERE TO GO

Visitations begin at scheduled time promptly! Please arrive ten minutes before the beginning of visitation. All visitors shall come in the main entrance of the Butler County Juvenile Justice Center. All visitors are subject to search before entering the facility. Staff will identify appropriate visitors with a picture identification based on a list from the probation department. At the scheduled time, the group will be transported to the visitation area. All visitors will leave at the same time. **If you are late, you will be unable to visit!**

VISITATION RULES:

1. All visitors are subject to search.
2. Visitors should have picture identification upon entrance.
3. Visitors will be asked to sign the Visitor Log, identifying their relationship to the child. The Juvenile Rehabilitation Center staff shall check the Visitors Log against the Visitor List submitted by the Probation Department. Anyone found to have falsified information to obtain entrance will be charged with FALSIFICATION 2921.13 ORC.
4. The Butler County Juvenile Rehabilitation Center is not responsible for the personal property of visitors (purses and other personal belongings will not be allowed beyond security doors and should be locked in the car).
5. The Butler County Juvenile Rehabilitation Center is a non-smoking facility.
6. Parents will be allowed to bring certain items to their children based on the child's programming level.
 - Level "0" - Stamps, envelopes, paper, folders¹, and shoes.
 - Level "1" - Stamps, envelopes, paper, folders¹, and shoes.
 - Level "2" - Stamps, envelopes, paper, folders¹, shoes, and Clear stick acne medication.
 - Level "3" - Stamps, envelopes, paper, folders¹, shoes, and Clear stick acne medication.
A list of approved personal hygiene items shall be provided.
- Level 1, 2, and 3 residents can have a maximum of 15 pictures in their personal property. All items will be given to BCJRC staff for inspection prior to visitation. These items will be searched. Staff may refuse to allow any item into the building and are not required to return suspect items to the parent. Such items will be turned in to the facility Superintendent.
7. Visitors that attempt to smuggle contraband into the facility will be charged with ILLEGAL CONVEYANCE OF PROHIBITED ITEMS INTO a DETENTION CENTER 2921.36 ORC.
8. **Parents will sit at the table with their child and will not be permitted to pass items to the resident. You may hug your child at the start and end of visitation. Other than that, no physical contact is permitted.**
9. A visitation may be denied if there exist reasonable grounds to believe that the visit might endanger the security of the facility.
10. Visitors under the influence of alcohol/drugs shall not be permitted in the facility.
11. Any visitor who becomes disruptive or disrespectful to others during the course of the visit will be asked to leave.
12. Any violation of these rules will result in a loss of visitation privileges.
13. Failure to comply with court ordered family sessions or parent program can result in suspension of visitation privileges. This must be recommended by the youth's Probation Officer and approved by the Deputy Superintendent or Superintendent.

¹ There is to be no metal or plastic in the folders.
