

Constitution of the Hamilton Butler Co. Ohio Humain Society of  
Hamilton Butler County Ohio

The title and name of this Society shall be The Hamilton Butler  
County Ohio Humane Society.

Art. II.

This Society shall be a branch of the Ohio Humane Society

Art. III.

The object of this Society are to provide effective means for the  
prevention of cruelty to children and to animals in Butler County,  
Ohio., to enforce all laws of the State which are now, or may here  
after be enacted, for the prevention of cruelty to children and to  
animals, and to secure by lawful means the arrest, conviction  
and punishment of any person or persons violating such laws and  
to co-operate with other similar in carrying out there work

art. IV.

Section I This Society shall consist of active, contributing  
honorary and life members

Sec. 2 Any person if elected by the Board of Directors, may become  
active members of this Society upon the payment of one dollar  
annual dues

Sec. 3 Any person, if elected by the board of directors may  
become a contributing member of this society upon the payment of  
\$1.00 annual dues.

Sec. 4 Any person who shall be recommended by the of directors  
and shall be elected by two-thirds vote of the members present  
at the annual meeting of the society shall be an honorary member, b  
but no more than two persons shall be so elected in any one year

Sec 5 Any person of good character may become a life member by paying to the society the sum of \$50.00 and being elected as such by the Board of Directors.

Art. V

Art. V

sec 1 The officers of this Society shall consist of President Vice President Secretary atreasure and a Board of Seven Directors

Sec 2 The President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasure shall be ex-officiomembers of the Board of Directors

Sec. 3 The duties of the several officers shall be such as the Society or board of Directors shall prescribe.

Sec. 4 All officers shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting and shall hold there office for one year or untill there successors are duly elected and qualified.

Art. VI.

The Society may enact by-laws for its government fill vacancies in the offices and after thirty days written notice remove by a two third vote any officer for cause or upon a like vote, remove from its own body or from the Society any member, if in the judgement of the Society, the best intrest of the Society shall require it. no member of the Society shall incur adebt for the payment of whic provision is not made at the time.

Art. VII.

The Secretary shall receive all monies and shall deposit same with the Treasure, taking receipt for same. He shall give a bond satisfactory to the Society if required.

Art. VIII

The Treasure shall give a satisfactory to the society (if required)  
He shall present a statement of the finances of the Society when e  
ever required to do so by the Society, and also must have a statmen  
for the annual meeting. No money shall be paid out by the Treasure  
except upon the written order of the Secretary and approved by th  
President or in there absence one whom has been acting for the  
absent member

Art. VIII

Sec I The annual meeting of the Society shall be held on the first  
Sunday in April of each year

Sec.2. The regular meeting of the Society shall be on the first  
Sunday of each Month

Art. x.

This constitution may be ammended by a majority of all members pres  
ent at a meeting called for that purpose provided, that a notice  
of such alteration or amendment to be acted upon at such meeting  
is given in writting at least thirty days preceding such meeting
